	WHEREAS, a hearing having been had upon a petition praying that the Board of Trustees of this township take all lawful and proper proceedings to light as streets and public ways in an unincorporated district in this township, following actual view taken, and the board of township trustees finding:						
	1)	That the petition for Wetherby Farms, Section <u>6B</u> was filed with the township fiscal officer on <u>September 8, 2009</u> and that the board of township trustees was duly notified by him of such filing and a copy of the petition was delivered to it on <u>September 8, 2009</u> ; and					
	2)	That the petition was signed by owners of more than one-half of the front feet of the lots and lands abutting on the streets and public way of the aforesaid district, and that the petition complied with law in specifying the metes and bounds of the district but included no lands more than 660 feet from, nor any lands not abutting on, the streets and public ways in such districts; and					
	3)	That notice of a hearing before the board of township trustees on the petition for October 13, 2009, was duly and timely served on all lot owners.					
		EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Union Township, inty, Ohio by authority of Chapter 515 of the Ohio Revised Code, as follows:					
	SECTION 1:	That the proposed improvement to light artificially the streets and public ways in the district is necessary, and the petition is granted accordingly; that the number of lights necessary to light properly the streets and public ways is 2, that the lights shall be of 100 watt, 9,600 initial lumen high pressure sodium Granville Acorn street lights; that they shall be located as specified on the attached map.					
	SECTION 2:	So that the residents are not negatively impacted by a delay in the process of this resolution, that the petitioners agree to pay the lump sum costs, yet to be determined consistent with the construction and operation of the District, until such a time as the assessment is collected and distributed to the Township, upon proper notice from the Fiscal Officer.					
(All through a local)	SECTION 3:	That Duke Energy be and is hereby authorized and directed to install and maintain the street lighting system.					
	SECTION 4:	That said contract for the street lighting system as well as the purchase of the electrical energy for said system shall be in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Duke Energy street lighting service tariff, P.U.C.O. No. 17, sheet No. 60.4, or any amendments or revisions thereof.					
	SECTION 5:	That the property in the subdivision will be specially benefited by this lighting district. Accordingly, the costs of the improvement shall be assessed in an equal amount against each benefited lot to be determined by dividing the total cost per semiannual installment by the number of benefited lots. The estimated cost per assessed lot is \$6.98 annually.
